- It is subject to maintaining a high standard of flying and safety. It may be revoked by the Committee if these standards are not maintained
- I hold a BMFA A test (or recognized equivalent) for fixed wing aircraft
- I understand this waiver only covers the model detailed above
- I have completed the 'New Member' probationary period
- I will inform the committee if a long term condition arises that may affect my ability to fly safely. The Committee will then decide on the action to be taken, the Committee will try to accommodate the applicant's interests in its decision but safety has to be the primary consideration.

Waiver Validity

*** All 7.5Kg waivers will expire the 30th June of the expiry year. The Committee will decide the appropriate period of validity at the time the application is assessed. This has been done so that the 7.5Kg waiver expiry occurs in the summer, the best time to revalidate the 7.5Kg waiver.**

Limitation of Numbers The Committee may limit the number of 7.5Kg Waivers issued in the interests of the general club membership. This will be to ensure that all members have ‘equal opportunity’ to fly.
